Dear Parent/Carers,

We've had a great start to Term 4 and it's been great to see the children really enjoying their learning.

All classes have a geography focus to their topics this term. Oak Class have a particular focus on Bristol this term and are finding out why Bristol developed into a major city and what are it's plans for the future.

Beech class are trying to answer the question, 'How great is Great Britain?' They'll be looking at how London has changed over the years and will also be learning how to read maps and how to locate and identify rivers and seas.





Meanwhile, Willow class are finding out about The Great Fire of London. They have been looking at how people used fire in different ways long ago and learning about some of the dangers? Later in the term they'll be learning about Fire safety.

Fox-Talbot Day

As part of the 200th anniversary of Lacock Primary School, the children celebrated the birthday of the school's founder – William Fox Talbot on the last day of term 3. What better way to do that, than to take step back in time and walk in the shoes of Fox Talbot himself.

The children arrived at school from head to toe in Georgian dress, with Fox Talbot in his top hat and camera in hand to greet



them. With the ringing of the school bell, it was time to find out what life would have been like for a child in Georgian days.



The day began at National Trust's Lacock Abbey, which celebrates the life and works of Fox Talbot, and his input to the advances of photography. The children celebrated his life by congregating at the front of the Abbey to sing happy birthday, and with little delay it was time to learn all about life in 1824.

The National Trust put on some wonderful activities for the children, from letter writing to scrap-book making. The children learnt how communication used to happen by viewing some of Fox Talbot's letters, then creating and sealing some of

their own. They had time to explore the Abbey and spot significant parts of the building added at different times through history. To finish off, they had an incredible time creating their own scrap-books, learning that Georgians would have documented their favourite memories in this way.

After a very exciting morning, it was time to return to school for lunch with a Georgian twist! The children

delved into lunchboxes filled only with food available in 1824, of bread, cheese and fruit – with not a crisp packet in sight!

With tummy's full of healthy food — it was time to really step into the shoes of a Georgian child and take on some historic jobs. The teachers and parents of Lacock school led the children in an array of traditional jobs, from working in the laundry room, to tack cleaning, to chimney sweeping — the school even had the presence of a horse on its playground for the children to groom!



It truly was a memorable day for everyone involved, and the




children returned home with many of the wonderful things they had made during the day, including some wonderful keepsakes like lavender bags and wax candles.

We are so grateful to everyone involved in this incredible celebration of Fox Talbot's life, and it was the perfect way to begin the celebrations of our historic village school!
