



### Important Vocabulary

Papyrus	Material used by the Ancient Egyptians for writing or painting.
Hieroglyphics	Ancient Egyptian writing using symbols to represent whole words.
Symbol	A mark or picture that represents something.
Chassis	A base frame of a car, carriage, or other wheeled vehicle.
Tombs	Egyptians created beautiful and magnificent tombs inside the pyramids.
Cartouche	An oval shaped frame with a horizontal line at one end. It surrounds hieroglyphics that make up the name of a royal (pharaoh or queen).

### Key Facts

- Ancient Egyptians used 6 basic colours: white, **black**, **red**, **yellow**, **blue** and **green**. All of the colours had a specific meaning and significance. Some other colours were sometimes used like **brown**, **grey**, **orange** and **pink** but only as secondary colours. These colours were made by mixing white or black to the primary colours.
- The Egyptians were the first civilization to invent writing.
- There were many different Gods that the Ancient Egyptians worshipped. Many took the form of an animal.
- Ancient Egyptians mummified dead bodies so that they could go to the afterlife.



### Creating Art

The Ancient Egyptians used **papyrus** to write or paint on. Paintings could depict everyday life in Ancient Egypt, images of the gods or goddesses, or **hieroglyphics**.

Papyrus is a special kind of paper made using the stems of the papyrus plant which grows along the banks of the River Nile.
