### What is an traditional tale narrative?

A traditional tale narrative is **a story that has been retold over many years.**

Traditional tales include a beginning which introduces the characters and describes the setting of the story. They usually have a problem and a solution often resulting in a happy ending.

A setting is where the story takes place such as a castle, a woods or a jungle. Many of the characters in these stories include animals, princes and princesses.

There are often lots of different versions of the same story that can have many similarities and differences.
