The hottest time of the year. Flowers and trees are in full bloom.

Key Knowledge/Facts

- I can name the four seasons in cycle
- In autumn many trees leaves change colour to orange, red, yellow and brown. These leaves will fall off leaving the trees bare in winter.
- Evergreen trees do not lose their leaves in the autumn.
- In winter the weather becomes much colder. We may have frosty mornings when the temperature falls below 0 degrees Celsius.
- That days are shorter in the winter.
- Weather data can be collected and displayed on a pictogram
